Strand 4: Information Literacy

Standard A: Students will use technology to conduct research and locate information from a variety of resources.

Uses teacher recommended or reference databases (SIRS, INFOhio, online encyclopedias, WebQuests, etc) and/or search

Types an URL correctly (web address)

Uses a successful research strategy for locating information such as the "Big Six"

Copies and pastes text or images and cites image sources correctly

Creates graphic organizers to sort and make sense of information

Evaluates relevance of information to student's purpose

Evaluates authenticity, validity, and accuracy of information and sources (such as author, copyright date)

Strand 8: Multimedia

Standard A: Students will create developmentally appropriate multimedia projects using available technology resources for problem solving, illustration of thoughts, ideas, and stories to communicate effectively to targeted audiences.

Plans and storyboards ideas for presentation

Creates and modifies text objects or text boxes

Use technology to tell what was learned from information gathered (e.g., use simple presentation tools to create a poster, book, slide show)

Edits and revises project for content and style

Inputs and formats sound (such as voice and music)

Creates a linear presentation with text, graphics, and sound

Includes graphics, backgrounds and clip art

Arrange & rearrange items in a project

Create a video production using video editing software

Use appropriate technology resources for presenting information

Strand 9: Communication

Standard A: Students will properly present independent research findings in a multimedia presentation.

Student recognizes the audience while developing their presentation

Gathers information from outside sources (e-mail, internet) through electronic means

Uses appropriate eye contact

Determines goal and purpose of presentation for target audience
