

## American Four-Square (c. 1900-1920)

One of the most common residential building types in the early 20th century, the American Four-Square is found in several Old Hilliard residences. The essence of the Four-Square is a two-story house with hip or gable roofline, wide eaves and a porch across the front. Characterized by a simple rectangular floor plan, this building type could be rendered in either brick or wood. Variety was provided by subtle variations in windows, dormers, and front porch columns. Three examples in Old Hilliard illustrates a variety of treatments, but also share common features in overall proportions, roof dormers, front porch design, and entrance placement. The presence of a three-part window on the first floor is also noted in each.
